Materials:

3-4 feet of paracord

Two beads for eyes

{Cost for this project starts about \$1.99}

Step 1: Fold your paracord in half and thread one bead on each end. If you want a snap hook, thread it on first.

Step 2: Arrange the beads so they are about 3.5 inches from the middle. Fold each side of paracord down at the beads.

Step 3: Bring the right cord over the center cords and under the left cord.



Step 4: Bring the left cord behind the center cords and up through the loop on the right. Carefully pull the knot tight.

Step 5: Now take the left cord and bring it over the center cords and under the right cord.

Step 6: Bring the right cord behind the center cords and up through the loop on the left. Tighten the knot.

Repeat steps 3 through 6 but do not tighten the knots. The next step will create a set of wings.



Pull on the top loops. This will tighten the bottom knot. Pull on the working ends to tighten the knot or adjust the wings if needed and push up on the knot to close any gaps.

Repeat steps 3 through 6 again and do not tighten the knots.



Pull the top loops and create a set of wings. Tighten and push up on the knot.

Repeat steps 3 through 6 a few times and tighten each knot as you go until you reach the desired length.



Trim and melt the ends. You can add a split ring now if you did not at the beginning.



This can also be made without beads and just leave small loops at the top for the eyes. We used our color changing beads that will change from white to colors like yellow, pink, or blue in the sun. They also glow in the dark.
